Satisfied at Brown

In the spring of 2006, the Office of Institutional Research asked seniors to reflect upon their time as undergraduates. Through their participation in the *Senior Survey*, nearly two-thirds of the Class of 2006 offered insights into the value of a Brown education.

Overwhelmingly, these students were happy with the education they received. But what about their futures? What were they planning to do once they left Brown?

92% were generally or very satisfied with education

93% probably or definitely would encourage a high school senior to attend

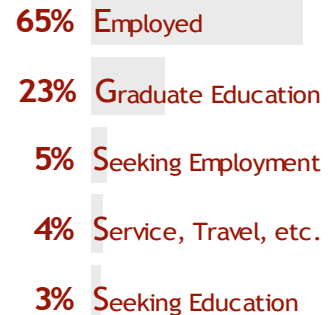

After Commencement

In addition to the *Senior Survey*, the Career Development Center gathered data on the Class of 2006, after they left Brown, through the *Outcome Survey*. While this provides an updated picture of activities in the fall following graduation, the results of the two surveys are consistent.

Most entered the world of employment, while almost a quarter chose to pursue further study in graduate or professional school. The *Senior Survey* revealed that traveling and volunteer work would be common secondary activities.

A Decade of Pursuits

Brown graduates engage in a wide variety of careers and academic pursuits, illustrated by the small samples to the left. Ten years out of Brown, our alumni continue to excel.

According to the 2005 *Alumni Survey*, since receiving their undergraduate degree, 78% of the Class of 1994 had enrolled in some type of graduate or professional degree program. Nearly all were employed.

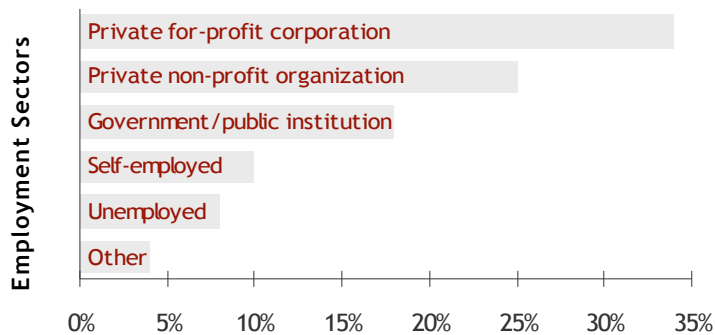

The *Alumni Survey*, similar to the *Senior Survey*, asked respondents to indicate their level of satisfaction with Brown. Just as the Class of 2006 was generally happy, so too was the Class of 1994, ten years after their graduation.
