Date & Time Reported	Incident Type	Location	Summary/Disposition
09/09/09 11:27pm	Assist Providence Police / Miscellaneous	Fish Co. Bar & Grill	Brown University officers were dispatched to assist the Providence police with an investigation involving Brown students. Upon arrival they were advised by Providence officers that two Brown students were involved in an altercation with Fish Co. staff and then with Providence officers. The two students were arrested by the Providence police and were being charged with disorderly conduct.
09/11/09 10:20am	Breaking & Entering / No Force	Sears House	A Brown student reported three handbags with a total value of over six thousand dollars stolen from her room. She had last noticed the bags on 09/10/09 at 4pm and on 09/11/09 at 9am she noticed them missing. The room door was left unlocked.
09/11/09 4:12pm	Larceny	Grad Tower C	Brown University student stated that she had secured her mountain bike to the bike rack on 09/06/09 at 8:50am. She stated that she went to retrieve her bike on 09/11/09 at 9:30am and it was gone. The new kryptonite chain and lock were still attached to the bike rack and were not damaged. She stated that the way she attached the bike may have left the bike vulnerable because if the handlebars were removed the bike could be freed without disturbing the lock.
09/12/09 12:00am	Assist Providence Police / Miscellaneous Noise Complaint	212 Williams Street	Brown University police responded with Providence police after Providence police received a call about a loud party with revelers filling the street. When Brown police arrived Providence officers were already on scene and actively dispersing the partygoers and closing down the party. Four renters of the property, all Brown University students, were cited by PPD for violating the noise ordinance.
