Sunday's playoff hopes were cut short by a narrow defeat to Santa Cruz. Fortunately, great plays were found everywhere by everyone. One key play against N. Carolina took place after a timeout. Coach Paul called for a 2-3-2 zone defense in our own end zone. This caught NC off guard, causing them to work the disc away from our end zone; and then a hard mark by rookie Aaron Roberts '10 led to a 'D' by Captain Ben Saper '07, eventually leading to a break point for BMO!

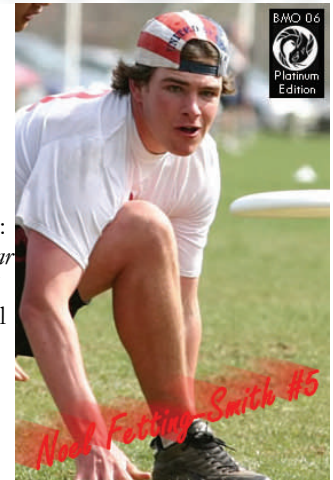
Please Support Bmo's Program!
