The Education Department at Brown University invites applications for a tenure-track position as Assistant Professor of Education beginning July 1, 2010. The successful candidate will be one who examines the politics, organization, and governance of education. Candidates will be evaluated on the basis of their demonstrated potential for excellence in scholarly research and teaching.

Candidates must hold an earned doctorate in political science, sociology, or another social science discipline by the job start date of July 1, 2010. Candidates with an earned doctorate from an education or a public policy school will be considered if they have evidence of strong social science training. The Department is particularly interested in candidates who analyze policy issues facing urban districts and state systems. One of the responsibilities of this faculty will be to teach a core graduate-level course on “policy analysis and program evaluation for education” in Brown’s Urban Education Policy program. This course aims to make students critical consumers of policy relevant research that addresses causal questions and to equip them with tools to conduct their own research. Depending on his or her qualifications, the candidate may hold joint appointment with the Taubman Center for Public Policy Studies.
