

Hispanic Studies Concentration Guide and Worksheets

These worksheets have been designed to help you understand the different requirements for fulfilling a concentration in Hispanic Studies and to keep track of your progress in your concentration.

There are currently two different concentrations, and one of them has two tracks. Choose the one that best meets your needs.

- **CONCENTRATION IN HISPANIC LITERATURE AND CULTURE.**
 - Option A: Hispanic Literature and Culture.**
 - Option B: Interdisciplinary Peninsular literature and culture.**
 - Option C: Interdisciplinary Latin American literature and culture.**

- **CONCENTRATION IN LANGUAGE AND LINGUISTICS.**

As you pursue your program of study, fill in the blanks below with the courses that satisfy each requirement. You should bring a copy of this worksheet each time you meet with your advisor. Remember: you must declare a concentration by filing a program form with the registrar and a copy to the department, no later than Semester IV. If you are thinking about a concentration in Hispanic Literature and Culture, you should consult with your advisor by Semester IV, and bring a copy of this worksheet with you. After declaring your concentration, we encourage you to meet with your advisor at least once during Semester V, and once by mid-semester of Semester VII.

At least one of these courses should be pre- twentieth century. Students should gain knowledge of a variety of literary genres. (Capstone course may go here.)

5. It is also required to take the Capstone course. HISP1900, ISSUES IN HISPANIC LITERATURE AND CULTURE. This course may be used in place of one of the above 1000 level requirements).

* With the approval of the concentration advisor, up to two 1000-level courses may be replaced by courses in another Romance literature, in comparative literature, or another appropriate field.

One introductory Cognitive and Linguistic Science courses from the following: COGS80 (Meaning and Thought); COGS320 (The Biology and Evolution of Language); COGS410 (Introduction to Linguistic Theory); COGS450 (Language and Mind.) *Please note: since COGS410 serves as a prerequisite for many higher level courses in COGS, we recommend that students take COGS 410.

5. _____

Two additional courses: One 1000-level course approved by the concentration advisor in COGS; and one from the following: ANTH1800 (Sociolinguistics); PHIL850 Philosophy of Language; POBS1500 (Topics and Themes); POBS1600 (Topics and Themes in Portuguese and Brazilian Literature and Civilizations); HISP1500 (Special Topics in Hispanic Literature). * With the approval of the concentration advisor, these courses may be replaced by linguistics courses in another Romance language.

* Up to four courses from study abroad can be applied towards concentration requirements, provided that they have been approved by the concentration advisor.

Students need 8 credits to concentrate.
