International Scholarship Awards – Application deadline extended to October 30, 2009

The International Scholars Program provides an opportunity for undergraduate students to make international studies an integral part of their Brown curriculum. Twenty scholarships will be awarded for the current academic year. Students will receive up to \$5000 to support an international research project in Summer 2010, will work with an international mentor, and may be eligible for an additional \$1000 to help cover expenses for a capstone project in their senior year. Sophomores and juniors are encouraged to apply.

UTRAs provide students with opportunities to work closely in research situations with faculty members, to participate integrally in the process of course development and revision, and to experience the work of the college directly.

Every spring, up to twenty students at Brown are inducted into the Society of Royce Fellows, receiving an award of up to \$4,000 to pursue a project of their own design. The program seeks to enable undergraduates to explore their developing interests and passions and enhance the ideals of Brown's innovative open curriculum.

Jane C. Waldbaum Archaeological Field School Scholarship – Application deadline March 15, 2010 http://www.archaeological.org/webinfo.php?page=10400

This scholarship provides \$1000 each for up to seven successful applicants to help pay expenses associated with participation on an archaeological excavation or survey project (minimum stay: one month). The scholarship is open to junior and senior undergraduate students and first-year graduate students who are currently enrolled at a college or university in the U.S. or Canada. Applicants must be at least 18 years old and have not previously participated in an archaeological excavation.

Each year, BIAP/AIP offers funding for unpaid or low paying summer internships. The award programs encourage students to pursue career exploration through summer internships in all career fields, including labor relations, socially responsible careers and careers in the creative arts, music and entertainment.

- BIAP: Funding awards in the amount of \$2,500 are available for career exploration in a wide variety of fields. Approximately 40 BIAP awards will be available for the summer of 2010.
- AIP: Students who are on financial aid and eligible for University scholarship may apply for a waiver of their summer earnings requirement. For summer 2010, 25 summer earnings waivers of up to \$2,800 will be awarded.

Greene Farm Archaeology Project, directed by Brown faculty members Krysta Ryzewski and Caroline Frank, focuses on documenting and interpreting five centuries of cultural and natural landscape transformations on one of the few remaining Providence Plantations. The project accepts a limited number of experienced Brown undergraduate archaeology students each field season, usually in June. Past years' students have been funded by UTRA's for this research.
