

Patrícia Silva McNeill is Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Centre for Social Studies, University of Coimbra and at the Department of Iberian and Latin American Studies, Queen Mary University of London, working on a project entitled ‘Modernism as a Transcultural Phenomenon: Transatlantic Networks, Transits and Exchanges between Euro-American and Luso-Brazilian Sites of Modernism’, funded by the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology (FCT). Additionally, she is a team-member of the project “1915 – The year of the ORPHEU: Mapping the socio-historical context of Portugal’s First Modernism”, coordinated by Steffen Dix (Centre for Studies of Communication and Culture, Catholic University, Lisbon) also funded by the FCT. Previously, she was Visiting Research Fellow at the School of Advanced Study of the University of London and taught Introduction to the Language and Literature of Portugal, Brazil and Portuguese-speaking Africa at the University of Cambridge. She is the author of *Yeats and Pessoa: Parallel Poetic Styles* (Legenda, 2010). Other recent publications include chapters on esotericism in the poetry of Fernando Pessoa and W. B. Yeats in *Fernando Pessoa’s Modernity without Frontiers: Influences, Dialogues, Responses* (Tamesis, 2013), and on the reception of Darwin in the work of Eça de Queiroz in *The Reception of Charles Darwin in Europe: Literary and Cultural Reception* (Bloomsbury, 2014).
