

Stefan Helgesson is professor of English at Stockholm University. His research interests include southern African literature in English and Portuguese, Brazilian literature, postcolonial theory, translation theory and theories of world literature. He is the author of *Writing in Crisis: Ethics and History in Gordimer, Ndebele and Coetzee* (2004) and *Transnationalism in Southern African Literature* (2009), has edited volume four of *Literary History: Towards a Global Perspective* (2006) and is co-editor of *Literature, Geography, Translation* (2011). He is currently working on two parallel projects, one which concerns the problem of history and narrative temporality in Brazilian and South African writing, and another which—by way of four case studies—looks at the differentiated consolidation of literary identity in postcolonies.

Stefan Helgesson é professor de Inglês na Universidade de Estocolmo. Seus interesses de pesquisa incluem Literatura Sul-africana em Inglês e Português, Literatura Brasileira, teoria pós-colonial, teoria da tradução e teorias da literatura mundial. Ele é o autor de *Writing in Crisis: Ethics and History in Gordimer, Ndebele and Coetzee* (2004) e *Transnationalism in Southern African Literature* (2009), editor do vol. IV de *Literary History: Towards a Global Perspective* (2006) e co-editor de *Literature, Geography, Translation* (2011). Atualmente, ele trabalha em dois projetos paralelos, um deles sobre o problema da história e temporalidade narrativa nas Literaturas Brasileira e Sul-africana, e o outro – por meio de quatro estudos de casos – enfoca a consolidação diferenciada de identidade literária em ex-colônias.
