Located at corner of Thomas and Main,
near front steps of yard

9/18 Adam + Rod

Removed sod, began first arbitrary unit - discovered heavy root system - did not complete first 10 cm.

Found 4 pieces of glass (very small) one of which was amber glass.
one piece of cigarette filter
one spearmint wrapper (part)

9/25 Jennifer + Rod

Finished the first 10 cm. Measured with the level.

Started and finished 2nd arbitrary unit. 20 cm in all four corners. Heavy root system throughout.

Found: 7 pieces of glass: 6 brown colored
(one w/ numbers)
4 white colored

- 1 piece of paper with exact date: 8-30-92
- 1 button
- 6 pieces of ceramic: 1 w/ design
 - 2 pieces of red glaze (tile?)
 - 3 pieces of ceramic w/ white glaze
- 1 piece of charcoal

• 10/2 Tina & Jen

- Begun digging 30cm level
- Soil was very dense & packed with lots of roots.
- Could not finish the level, got about halfway completed

Artifacts found:

3 pieces glass

- 1 large rounded

- 1 with writing (letters (C?))

1 piece wood

1 piece rounded brick

1 piece plastic thing

10/16 - Tina & Christian

- measured at NE corner at 24 cm to start dig.
- decided to only dig northeast quarter of the lot since the lot is so rooty.
- had to cut through a couple large roots

Artifacts in 20-30cm level

: 1 coin

ceramic (white & red ceramic)

glass (window glass, vessel glass)

burnt clay,

coal.

rusty metal piece.

hollow, unidentified metal object.

Shell

10-30-06

We started the day by finishing the lot from
20 - 30 cm and leveling it off. The lot is now in
the Northeast corner of the unit, 70 cm North / South
7.5 cm East / West. Artifacts were one piece of vessel glass

We then started and finished excavation of lot 4
from 30 - 40 cm.

Compressed topsoil that got pushed under was found.

artifacts included. Ceramic, .. architectural and vessel glass,
a pipe bowl, metal, and coal.

11/6/06

Started and Finished Lot # 5

40-50 cm. in NE Corner Pit.

Cut some large roots.

Found very compressed, porous soil.

Artifacts:

Brick - 6

Ceramic - 1

Glass - 6

Coal - 1

Metal - 2

One of the metal pieces is a nail.
The ceramic may date to the 1860's.
