







FIG. 4. PLAN AND SECTION OF TOMB OF MEHENKWETRE








ELEVATION OF PORTICO.








FRONT ELEVATION.




Figure IV.20: Landscape Evoked on the West Wall




Figure V.1: Environments Depicted in Tomb 3






Figure V.2: Map of the Local Landscape Provided in Tomb 3







Figure V.3: Map of Larger Cosmos Evoked in Tomb 3




Figure V.4: Temporal Cycles represented in Tomb 3




Figure V.5: Narrative Progression in Tomb 3








Figure V.6: Orientations of Major Figures and Flow Pattern of Tomb 3












Plan of the tomb of Hepzefa at Siut












