
Map of the Second Cataract showing fortress area






#### First Semna Stela of Senwosret III

Southern boundary, made in the year 8, under the majesty of the King of Upper and Lower Egypt, Khakaure Senwosret III who is given life forever and ever; in order to prevent that any Nubian should cross it, by water or by land, with a ship or with any herds of the Nubians, except a Nubian who shall come to do trading in Iqen (Mirgissa) or with a commission. Every good thing shall be done with them, but without allowing a ship of the Nubians to pass by Heh, going downstream, forever.

"...I have made my boundary further south than my fathers,




I am a king who speaks and acts,





## Inscription of Henu, Dynasty 11

- "[My lord] sent me out to despatch a ship to Punt, to fetch him fresh myrrh ...
- Then I went out from Koptos, along the road which his majesty had commanded for me; there was with me a force from Upper Egypt ...
- I went out with a force of 3000 men ... Now I made 12 wells along the valley floor, 2 wells in Idahet ... and another in Iahetib ...

Then I reached the sea. Then I made this ship"
