# Some historical realities in the settlement process

- Vast majority of Arab settlement was in Syria and Iraq
- Movement of peoples was closely associated with the conquests and the army
- The emergence of the amsar (s. misr) as nodes for Arab/Muslim settlement
- Maintaining the productive capacity of the land was reflected in patterns of land tenure




## Categories of Early Islamic Urbanism before the Abbasids

- De Novo cities
  - Amsar
  - Qusur and planned towns (e.g. Ayla, Anjar)
- Existing Cities
  - Resettlement within the existing towns
  - Building adjacent variation of the misr concept
  - Defensive settlement Ribat, thughur and awasim


### Basra, Kufa and the earliest amsar


- Conventional designation is as "garrison towns"
- Served as foci of
   Arab/Muslim settlement
   that segregated them from indigenous populations
- Presumed tribal organization of the khitta
- What accounts for the absence of amsar in Syria?











#### The Attraction of Syira/Bilad al-Sham







