


Tablets (two forms) vs. painted inscriptions on vessels




Map showing where Linear B tablets have been found (special emphasis on those with archives)



Locations where painted Linear B inscriptions have been found






1 Knossos tablet Co 907, listing sheep, goats, pigs and cattle




