Frank X. Gaspar é autor de cinco colecções de poesia e dois romances. Entre os seus muitos prémios, contam-se os Morse, Anhinga, e Brittingham Prizes de poesia, múltiplas inclusões em Best American Poetry, três prémios Pushcart, uma National Endowment for the Arts Fellowship em literatura, e uma California Arts Council Fellowship em poesia. O seu primeiro romance, *Leaving Pico*, foi vencedor do Barnes and Nobel Discovery Prize, e recebeu o California Book Award for First Fiction, bem como uma inclusão no New York Times Notable Book (edição brochada). O seu segundo romance, Stealing Fatima, foi o MassBook of the year em ficção (Massachusetts Foundation for the Book). Ambos os romances foram traduzidos e publicados em Portugal. Escritos seus são publicados regularmente em revistas literárias, incluindo, entre outras, The New Yorker, The Nation, The Harvard Review e The American Poetry Review. Foi convidado a ocupar a Helio and Amelia Pedrosa/Luso-American Foundation Endowed Chair na University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth, e a de Escritor-em-Residência da 2016 Ferrol A. Sams Distinguished Chair, na Mercer University. Actualmente, lecciona no Programa de Pós-Graduação da Pacific University, Oregon.
