



Cardiovascular Surgery Research Training Program T32 HL160517-02 Postdoctoral Fellowship

Cardiovascular diseases are the major causes of morbidity and mortality in the United States. The Cardiovascular Surgery Research Training Program aims to prepare next-generation scientists and clinician/scientists in state-of-the-art cardiovascular research by training surgery residents and postdoctoral fellows through outstanding mentored research experiences. This Program, funded by the National Heart Lung and Blood Institute, will help advance basic and translational research to develop novel therapeutic modalities by a group of well-trained cardiovascular academic researchers.

Two postdoctoral positions are available at Rhode Island Hospital and the Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University. The 2-year program is for surgical residents or PhD postdocs interested in cardiovascular research. Surgical resident applicants should be PGY2 or above, and PhD applicants should have less than 5 years' experience. Women and minority candidates are encouraged to apply. US citizenship or permanent resident status is required.
