Brown in Hong Kong Program

Begun in 2006, the partnership between Brown and the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) has resulted in the Brown in Hong Kong program and the Brown Plus One program option. CUHK's beautiful 350-acre campus overlooks Tolo Harbour and is the largest and greenest in Hong Kong. In addition to its state-of-the-art classroom buildings, the campus includes world-class libraries, art museums, music halls, swimming pool, sports fields, tennis courts, squash courts, water sports center and gymnasiums.

At A Glance

Program Dates: Fall semester (late August – late December) or spring semester (early January – mid-May) or full academic year (late August – mid-May)

Language of Instruction: English, Cantonese and Mandarin (Putonghua)

Housing: Double rooms with local students in residence halls with required meal plan at S.H. Ho College (three communal dining per week, including one High Table Dinner per month)

Eligibility: Open to Brown undergraduate students.

Requirements: Students must be in good academic standing. No previous language study is required.

Courses

Students choose courses from all areas except the Faculty of Education, Law, Medicine and other departmental restrictions. Students must enroll in at least one Mandarin or Cantonese language course as part of their program of study at CUHK.

Host Institution

Founded in 1963, the Chinese University of Hong Kong is a comprehensive research university with over 20,000 undergraduate and post-graduate students. It offers a focus on undergraduate teaching, a wide range of research programs and a residential college system unique among Hong Kong universities.

S.H. Ho College is a fully residential college that provides regular communal dining, diversified activities, cross-cultural exposure and a general education program. Founded in 2006, the College seeks above all to provide its students with a welcoming environment they can call home and is attentive to tried and tested traditions of whole-person education.
