The Department of Emergency Medicine at the Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University in Providence, RI offers a one year ACGME-accredited fellowship in Emergency Medical Services (EMS) with an option of a second year in a combined EMS and disaster medicine (or other) fellowship with an MPH. There are two fellowship positions annually.

Graduates are clinically proficient in prehospital care and medical direction, including critical care transport and emergency ambulance response, mass event and disaster medicine, and are prepared to serve as medical directors for ambulance services, as EMS administrators, as researchers in disaster and EMS, and as competent EMS faculty in residency training programs.

The successful fellow attains these general EMS educational objectives by following the ACGME/NAEMSP EMS Fellowship Curriculum and is prepared and qualified to take the ACGME EMS board examination.

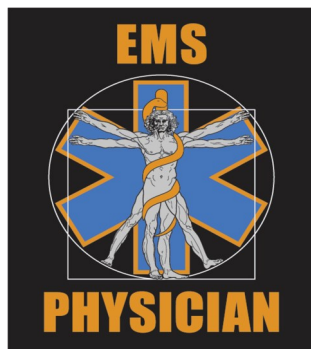
Enjoy rotations at over fifteen sites, including: RI Dept. of Health Center for EMS; Providence EMA; nearby helicopter

programs; tactical EMS; US Coast Guard Station Castle Hill Newport; RI DMAT/MRC; Cuttyhunk Volunteer Fire and Rescue; multiple EMS services (urban, rural, fire-based, third service) including Cumberland Rescue, the East Providence Fire Department, and South Kingstown EMS. Combined, these sites see approximately 75,000 patients annually.

LifePACT, Rhode Island's only Critical Care Transport Team, is based at Rhode Island Hospital, and transports over 1,500 patients annually. LifePACT ambulances are staffed by physicians, nurses and paramedics with extensive patient care and teaching experience.

Fellows serve as transport physicians on LifePACT and rotate in the emergency department at Rhode Island Hospital, a busy teaching hospital seeing over 110,000 adult ED patients annually. RIH is the only Level I trauma center and comprehensive stroke center in the region, and is the major teaching hospital for Brown. Our EMS Fellows are *not* sent to a remote site for ED shifts, and have the option to moonlight.



EMS Fellow's typical weekly schedule:

- 1 clinical emergency department shift,
 - 2 shifts LifePACT critical care transport,
 - 1 shift EMS academic time (curricular topics, research, QA, journal club, etc.),
 - 1 shift EMS site rotation / medical direction,
- Moonlighting shift optional.
