Professor White's research interests include population redistribution and urbanization in response to economic transitions, emergence and reproduction of inequality, and spatial data analysis. Her current research addresses the population redistribution and inequality that resulted from the U.S.-led economic shift in early twentieth-century Puerto Rican agriculture, the emergence and persistence of the spatial distribution of U.S. child poverty, and the nature and consequences of the Return Migration of the later twentieth century. She pursues these areas of interest using advanced methods of spatial analysis.
