BUILDING FOR ENVIRONMENTAL RESEARCH & TEACHING

The design build team, of Gilbane/Toshiko Mori/ Todd Rader, has completed the transformative work of converting a straight forward 1950's building into one worthy of both the important research conducted within it and its location on The Walk.

The project is expected to easily achieve LEED Gold status with innovative features such as a rainwater recapture system, chilled beams, and LED lighting. A Maya Lin sculpture in the green space on the north side of the building is planned for installation this fall.

REMARKABLE (REALLY!) DOCUMENT MANAGEMENT SOULUTION ROLLED OUT

software system titled "Meridian Document Management." Document management software stores digital documents in a central database and allows staff to "describe" each document in the system, allowing for easy retrieval at ing to Facilities Management staff on a later time by utilizing a web browser. Although Facilities has just "gone live" with its Meridian Document Management system, there is much excitement about the benefits of having easy access to documents that, until now, have been largely buried either in flat files or deep within folders on our shared network drives.

Our initial roll-out includes legacy construction as-built plans, called "record drawings", and Operations and Maintenance (O&M) manuals for twenty of our most equipment-intensive buildings. In addition, already loaded are master floor plans for all buildings as well as campus maps, which include utility and infrastructure maps for the entire campus.

The completed integration, between the Meridian Document Management system and our FAMIS system, will largely benefit the Operations group in their daily maintenance activities. Documents loaded into the Meridian Document Management system can be retrieved directly from within FAMIS. Additionally, we can more easily provide required documentation to consultants on projects initiated by our Planning Design & Construction (PD&C) group.


Nearly 9000 documents have been loaded into the system thus far, yet this represents only a small subset of the documents that we plan to gradually add during the next several months. All of the plans and O&M manuals for the remaining 220+ buildings currently housed in the CAD/Plan Room have

In late June, we officially unveiled a new been scanned and will be added to the system as documents are "described." There are many plans for continued development of the system, which include loading the documentation for the remaining buildings and providing trainhow to access and utilize the new system. A newly installed 75", touchscreen monitor, in the CAD/Plan Room, will be utilized to review large format drawings held in the system. This new monitor has been installed on a movable cart so that it can be utilized in our conference rooms as well.

> The documents in the system will also be accessible via mobile devices and will integrate into our FAMIS Mobile Solution. That project is slated to begin this fall. Additionally, we will be working towards piloting an "active" PD&C project which will include not only the plans and O&M manuals but all related project documentation. Ultimately, we plan to have all active projects in the system so that, when a project is finished, the archival process is automatically complete and documentation required by our Operations group is readily available.

You are encouraged to provide feedback regarding the new system to the Systems & Services group. Your input is invaluable to ensure that the continued development of the system best meets the needs of all our staff.

THAYER, ONLY BETTER

Curbs are being dropped and the roads repaved, but wait, there are more changes to come... beautification, enhanced pedestrian safety, metered parking, and calmer traffic flow are all goals of a collaborative project to improve our favorite lunch and coffee spot, Thayer Street. Driven by the desire to improve a resource that benefits us all, a diverse team that included the city, Brown, the College Hill Neighborhood Association, and the Thayer Street District Management Authority supported an extensive planning effort on Thayer Street that wrapped up last year. NEW BUILDING FOR SCHOOL OF ENGINEERING





Design will soon commence for a new School of Engineering building. The building will house high tech research labs and many core research facilities such as clean rooms, electron microscopes, and a nano-tools facility in approximately 80,000 sf. 

PHASE III, BROWN TO BROWN HOME OWNERSHIP

The Brown to Brown Home Ownership Program, which has been a part of the Facilities Management Real Estate Department since 2009, is in the 3rd phase of updating and repairing underutilized residential properties to be purchased

by a faculty or staff member. The Brown to Brown program continues to benefit buyers by providing housing close to campus. The City of Providence benefits, as well as the University's College Hill neighbors, as the restored homes enhance the neighborhood and add to the

tax base as privately-owned residential properties. Pictures of the current homes being restored are in the column to the right. The University sold Brown to Brown program homes at 93 Brown Street in December, 2013, and 109 Brown Street in June, 2014. Additionally, 89 Benevolent Street was recently razed due to disrepair and structural deterioration.

The program is designed to encourage home ownership by faculty and staff adjacent to campus, and to return those properties to owneroccupied, tax-paying status.
